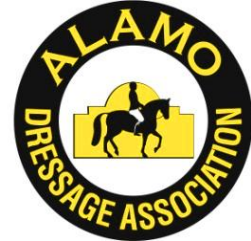

Please Note: *Due to the limited size of warm up areas, non-compete horses will not be allowed.*

RULES AND GENERAL INFORMATION

1. DIVISIONS:

Adult Amateur (AA): A rider age 21* and over who does not receive remuneration for instructing or coaching riders, or training or riding horses.

Junior- Under 13*: A rider under age 13.

Junior – 13 and over*: A rider between the ages of 13 and 20.

Open: Any rider who does not fall in the Adult Amateur or Junior divisions.

**Championship Classes Only: Junior riders who turn 13 or 21 during the ASSC qualifying year (Dec 1, 2017 – Nov 5, 2018) may compete in the ASSC division they were eligible for at the beginning of the qualifying year.*

2. ENTRY PROCEDURES: PLEASE READ CAREFULLY!!

A. Open Show Entries: Fill out ONE entry form for each rider/horse combination. *Negative Coggins form per horse is required and a payment of fees prior to distribution of bride number.* Please mail entries to entry show secretary, **Susan Peacock**. On-line entries are accepted at www.showsecretary.com. No post-dated checks accepted. Horse is not officially entered until payment & completed entry are received.

B. Championship Entries: IMPORTANT!!! In addition to the requirements in 2.A., Championship entries that have not submitted qualifying scores previously **MUST** include copies of their qualifying scores with their show entry!!! See Championship rules on qualifying in this prize list.

C. At the show: No bridle numbers will be issued without full payment and completed entries, *including signatures and emergency contact information.*

D. Entry Acceptance: Entries will be accepted on a first come-first serve basis based on postmark date until classes are filled except Championship entries will be given priority. Entries received after classes are filled will be notified and, if desired, put on a waiting list (in the order of postmark). Those entries postmarked after closing will be accepted at the discretion of the show secretary and show committee, based on a space available basis and charged a \$25.00 late fee. Those on the waiting list who entered show prior to closing date and did not get into the show will have all fees refunded. Management reserves the right to refuse any entry. **Entries close at & MUST BE POSTMARKED BY November 5, 2018.**

E. A copy of horse's negative Coggins form "blood drawn on" date drawn within 12 months of the show date must accompany each entry. Management will assume no responsibility for the health of horses being stabled. Owners are warned as they enter horses at their own risk.

F. Anyone mounting, getting on, riding or trying a horse at the facility during the weekend of the show (including Friday) must sign a show release form (see second page of entry form). For safety purposes, show management and ring stewards reserve the right to limit amount of non-competing riders in arenas.

G. Show management reserves the right to limit entries, add, combine, or divide classes, modify the schedule, add, substitute or change officials, modify or cancel awards and prizes and/or make whatever changes are required by circumstances to the competition specifications listed herein. Show management reserves the right to cancel classes insufficiently filled and to refuse or require withdrawal of an entry for cause deemed sufficient by show management.

H. Management reserves the right to cancel any classes due to hazardous weather, Acts of God, accident, or emergency. Every effort will be made to reschedule with priority given to any qualifying classes being offered. No refunds for cancellations due to hazardous weather, Acts of God, accidents or emergencies.

3. TESTS:

4. SCRATCHES & SUBSTITUTIONS: Exhibitors have the responsibility of informing the Show Secretary of their intention to scratch in writing. Please keep your receipt of notification of scratching for proof.

A. Scratches of the whole show made in writing to Show Secretary before the closing date may be made for any reason and all fees (except for office fee) will be refunded within thirty days after the show.

B. There are no refunds of fees after closing date.

C. All "no shows" that have not contacted the show office prior to first ride will be considered a scratch for the rest of the show and time slots may be filled. Exhibitors enter with this understanding and agreement.

5. LATE ENTRIES: All entries must be POSTMARKED on or before the closing date or will be considered a late entry. Each late entry will be charged a **late fee of \$25.00**. Late entries will be accepted and given a ride time only as schedule permits.

7. RETURNED CHECKS: A \$50.00 fee will be assessed for each returned check. All fees must be made good prior to packet pick-up.

8. RIDE TIMES/CONFIRMATION OF ENTRY: Preliminary ride times will be e-mailed before the show and ride times will be posted at the show grounds by noon on Friday. Any updates for the Championship Show will be posted by 5:00 PM on Friday. Any changes after closing date initiated by rider or owner will incur a **\$20 per change fee**.

9. BRIDLE NUMBERS: Bridle numbers for the show entered should be worn at all times.

10. FREESTYLES: Music for all freestyles on CD must be given to show office Saturday morning by 9am. Sound check will be at the lunch break. Competitors are responsible for picking up their music before the end of the show. Music left will not be mailed.

12. LEADLINE CLASS: To be ridden by a child who has **not** reached his/her **8th birthday as of December 31, 2018**. To be judged on manners and suitability of mount to rider and rider position/effectiveness. Children riding in this class are not eligible to compete in any other class. No stallions. One handler per entry; handler must be at least 18 years of age. Please list date of birth of competitor. Feet in stirrups, hands on reins, ASTM/SEI protective headgear, and boots are required. English or Western tack. No published pattern exists; all competitors ride in ring together.

13. EQUITATION CLASSES (includes WD Equitation):

A. Walk Equitation limited to riders who have never competed in Walk Trot Equitation, Intro Level or above, or WD Introductory Level or above. No published pattern exists; all competitors ride in ring together.

B. Walk-Trot Equitation limited to riders who have never competed at Training Level or above or WD Basic Level or above. No published pattern exists; all competitors ride in ring together.

15. FACILITIES & ARENAS: All tests and warm-up will be ridden in the indoor (sand/clay footing) arenas (sand footing). Competition arena is 20m x 60m. **Lunging permitted in indoor arena prior to 8am only.** No other lunging areas are available. All horses in the warm-up arenas must wear their competition numbers. Some classes may be ridden in small arena 20m X 40m.

16. DOGS: Dogs are not permitted to be loose on competition grounds and must be on a leash or otherwise contained. Individuals must not lead dogs on a leash while mounted. Dog owners are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from their dogs' behaviors. Dog owners failing to comply with this rule may be subject to penalty under Chapters 6 and 7 of the USEF General Rules, as well as issuance of warning cards. Loose dogs will be impounded and the owner will pay a \$200 fee.

17. CONCESSIONS: Concessions are available at the show grounds.

18. TACK & EQUIPMENT: USEF <http://www.usef.org/IFrames/RuleBook/rules.aspx> and WDAA (Western Dressage Association of America) <http://westerndressageassociation.org/western-dressage-rules-tests/> rules will be followed with regards to tack and equipment.

19. ATTIRE & HEADGEAR: Prefer attire that meets USEF/USDF and WDAA regulations but coats are optional. Dressage riders should dress with conservative color riding pants and shirts and footwear (dress or field boots, paddock or jodhpur boots - half chaps are allowed) and proper headgear (ASTM approved helmets). Western Dressage riders should follow WDAA regulations with regards to attire **except that anyone mounted on a horse must wear protective (ASTM approved) headgear including Western Dressage riders.**

20. RIBBONS, PRIZES, AND AWARDS:

A. Open Schooling Show: Ribbons for 1st through 6th place. Ribbons, prizes, and tests will be available after class has been pinned.

B. Championship:

1. The Championship will be pinned by Championship/Division. Individual classes ridden for the Championship will not be pinned.

2. See Section III of Championship Rules below.

21. HIGH POINT CHAMPION AND RESERVE: Open Schooling Show ONLY. Champion will be awarded to the horse/rider combination with the **highest score**. Championship and Freestyle scores are excluded. Reserve champion will be awarded to the second highest score. A minimum average score of 55% must be attained to be eligible.

22. ADA SCHOOLING SHOW CHAMPIONSHIPS

I. Rules for Qualifying

1. A horse/rider combination may qualify for the ASSC Championship by earning two (2) qualifying scores. Winning or placing in the class is not necessary as long as the score is earned.
 - a. At least one (1) score must be earned from schooling shows that are not USEF/USDF recognized competitions.
 - b. Scores must be earned at two (2) different competitions from two (2) different judges.
 - c. One (1) of the two (2) scores must be obtained from a USEF licensed judge or a judge who has graduated from the USDF L Program.
 - d. The schooling show must operate under USEF/USDF rules regarding tack and equipment for the classes for which scores are submitted. Scores from special classes (costume or other classes that do not meet USEF/USDF rules) are not eligible.
 - e. Scores must be obtained during the ASSC qualifying year (see 2.0).
 - f. Qualifying scores can be obtained from any test of the level the horse/rider combination is trying to qualify for.
 - g. Scores earned at the previous ASSC Championship Show are not eligible; however, Open show scores earned that weekend are eligible for the following year's championship.
2. **Qualifying Year:** The ASSC qualifying year is December 1, 2017 through November 5, 2018.
3. The ASSC show will be held in November of each year. See section IV.
4. A horse/rider combination having won the Championships at a certain level may not compete at that level or below in the Championships in subsequent years. However, the horse may compete at any level with a different rider or vice versa.
5. A horse/rider combination may qualify at two consecutive levels for the Championships.
6. Divisions – Western Dressage: Open division only. All riders, any age, amateurs and professionals.
7. Divisions – Classical Dressage:
 - Adult Amateur: A rider age 21* and over who does not receive remuneration for instructing or coaching riders, or training or riding horses.
 - Junior- Under 13*: A rider under age 13.
 - Junior – 13 and over*: A rider between the ages of 13 and 20.
 - Open: Any rider who does not fall in the Adult Amateur or Junior divisions.
 - *Junior riders who turn 13 or 21 during the “qualifying year” may compete in the division they were eligible for at the beginning of the qualifying year.

9. To qualify, riders must send the following WITH THEIR ENTRY FORM to the show secretary, postmarked by the closing date of the Championship horse show. See section IV.
- Two (2) qualifying scores. Either a copy of the front of a signed dressage test OR a copy of the show results.
 - \$20.00 qualifying fee. Do not send cash. Money order or a check payable to “ADA” are accepted forms of payment. This money funds cash prizes.

II. Championship Competition:

- Each horse/rider combination may not compete in more than one division (i.e., amateur and open – must declare division upon entry) at the ASSC Championships.
- A horse/rider combination may qualify and compete at two consecutive levels for the Championships.
- Introductory Level: Qualified horse/rider combination must ride both Test A and Test B at the Championship show. Scores will be averaged to determine placing in the Championship.
- Training – First Level: Qualified horse/rider combination must ride the highest two tests of the level at the Championship show. Scores will be averaged to determine placing in the Championship.
- Second Level and above: Qualified horse/rider combination only required to ride Test 1 of the level at the Championship show.
- Western Dressage: Qualified horse/rider combination must ride the highest two tests of the level at the Championship show. Scores will be averaged to determine placing in the Championship.
- Riders do not have to be ADA members to participate but will be required to pay a nonmember fee of \$20 when entering the ASSC show.
- All riders may carry a whip and have their test called.
- Competition Attire: Prefer attire that meets USEF/USDF regulations. Exceptions: Coats are optional. Conservative (dark) color breeches and half-chaps are permitted at all levels. All riders must wear protective headgear (ASTM approved helmets) while mounted.
- Tack and Equipment: Must meet USEF regulations.

11. Awards Ceremony: The top three riders are strongly encouraged to return mounted (preferred) or un-mounted (in competition attire) with or without horse, for the awards ceremonies. Awards Ceremony times will be posted at the show.

III. Championship Awards

1. Trophies or medals will be awarded for 1st, 2nd, & 3rd places. Ribbons will be awarded for first through sixth places.
2. Prize money will be awarded for first through third place. The amount is determined by the amount of fees collected from qualifying scores and the number of entries in all the Open, Amateur, and Junior/Young Rider Championships classes. It is allocated as follows: First/50%, Second/30%, and Third/20%. In the event a class only has two competitors, prize money will be split 60%/40%.
3. Prize money will be dispersed at the end of the show or mailed to the competitor if the competitor does not claim prize money at the show.
